Southern University at New Orleans (SUNO) was approved by the Louisiana State Board of Nursing (LSBN) to emerge the Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) program starting in the fall of 2022 at its June 16, 2022 meeting. SUNO'S BSN program will strengthen culturally competent nursing care, improve health outcomes, and create a more effective health care system. On June 27, 2022, we held our press conference, ribbon cutting, and tour.

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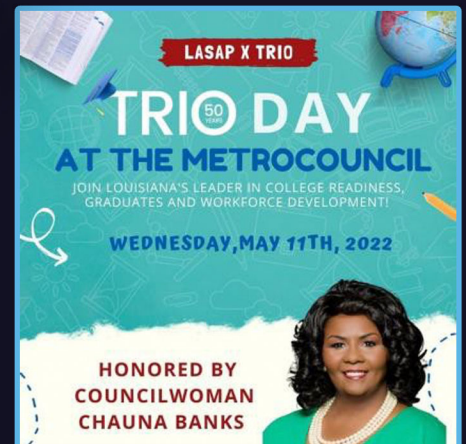
After the presser and ribbon cutting a tour will be given of the 12,000-square feet Natural Sciences building where the Department of Nursing is housed. The building includes:

Residential Life

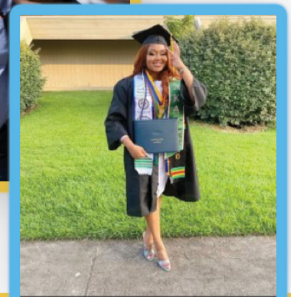

Dr. Ashley Ojo completed her work with the LOUIS Interactive OER for Dual Enrollment Grant. Dr. Ojo edited the Open Access Introduction to Psychology course textbook for the Dual Enrollment Course throughout Louisiana. She assisted in developing the Moodle classroom content, syllabus, course learning objectives, outcomes, and goals. Dr. Ojo plans to pilot this course.

Dr. Ashley Ojo presented and discussed in-depth information to the local community about "Combating Anxiety and Depression" during the Young Adult Personal Development and Wellness Seminar at Household of Faith Church in New Orleans, Louisiana.

Dr. Amedee plans to pilot this course.

Dr. George Amedee, Professor of Political Science and Emmett W. Bashful Endowed Chair, participated in the 2022 American Society of Public Administrators-Louisiana Conference. As a Speaker for the Conference, Dr. Amedee engaged and shared his current research, knowledge, and competencies with conference attendees in a 10 Minute Talk on Congressional Redistricting in Louisiana.

Dr. George Amedee, following his swearing-in as President-Elect of the Conference of Minority Administrators (COMPA) at the ASPA Annual Conference in Jacksonville, Florida, participated in the first meeting of the COMPA Executive Board via Zoom under the leadership of President Dr. Kelechi Uzochukwu, Associate Professor of the School of Public and International Affairs at the University of Baltimore. The focus of the meeting was to discuss the conference theme for 2023 and the appointment of an editor for COMPA's Journal.

Dr. Raymond Delaney participated in the 5th annual Global Academic Conference with the World Association for Academic Conference. Dr. Delaney presented his topic, "Managing Diverse Talents and Yielding Positive Results During a Pandemic and Natural Disaster." The conference Theme: The Threat of Contagious Diseases to Global Economies and Racial Inequality: Critical Issues and Ways Forward. The purpose of his presentation focused on a lived experience of a social entrepreneur and college professor in leadership. In his exhibition, he shared his leadership and management acumen with participants and identified the dynamics between leaders and followers. The presentation discovered ways of managing diverse talents, knowledge, skills, and attitudes while facing global and societal challenges. Dr. Delaney ended his presentation with a message of hope, resilience, and progression for ways forward and recommendations to prepare for future pandemics and natural disasters.

Dr. Raymond Delaney spoke with 179 juniors at Kenner Discovery Health Sciences Academy. Dr. Delaney discussed several topics within his conference titled "Rising Seniors: Putting the Pieces Together." Dr. Delaney discussed being different, managing embarrassment, putting yourself first, building confidence while learning to work things out when parents are not around, managing loneliness, overcoming feelings of being lost or unsure, and living outside the box.

SUNO is holding the STEAM Summer Camp for regional high school students from June 20 – July 20, 2022. The Pipeline Development of Skilled Workforce in STEM funds the camp through Advanced Manufacturing (STEAM) grant, the U. S. Department of Energy, National Nuclear Security Administration (NNSA), and the Minority Serving Institution Partnership Program (MSIPP).

Dr. Rachid Belmasrour is the camp's director, with Dr. Elaasar, Dr. Heon Kim, and Dr. Christian Clement as Co-Directors. Ms. Sherron Bates and Ms. Myeisha Miller are the Camp Coordinators. The camp consists of ACT Prep, general science lectures, 3D printing activities, Robotics, and research in different topics.
